

BASIC TIRE "101" By Dave Goerlich, Technical/Safety Chairman



The start of touring season requires a basic class on tires. First of all we need to know all the information embossed on the sidewalls of the tires. An understanding of those letters and numbers will make it much easier for you to decide which tires you need or want for your particular driving demands. For example, P-205/75R15M&S. The "P" stands for passenger car tire," 205" is the width of the tire (in millimeters), "75" is the tires aspect ratio or the tires sidewall height expressed as a percentage of its tread width, "R" denotes a radial tire, "15" is the diameter of the wheel in inches, "M&S" indicates a mud and snow rating. Tires intended for high performance, of

more interest to Porsche owners, will have an additional letter in the size code. This letter is the tire speed rating. On passenger car tires, "S" denotes a 112 mph rating, "T" is 118 mph, "V" is 124 mph, "H" is 130mph, "V" is 149 mph, "W" is 168 mph, "Y" is 186 mph and "ZR" is 149 mph and above. You have now been exposed to the basic tire class "101" so its time to check your Porsche tires.

Alegra Motorsports Wins Rolex 24 GT In Its Porsche 911 GT3 Cup

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. -- January 28, 2007

The Miami, FL - based Alegra Motorsports entry of Carlos de Quesada, Scooter Gabel, Marc Basseng, and Jean-Francois Dumoulin, with their # 22 Porsche 911 GT3 Cup racer, won the GT class at the Rolex 24 Hours at Daytona by a mere seven seconds after 668 laps of racing.

Dumoulin, from Trois Rivieres, Quebec, and the most experienced Grand American driver of the group, admitted the team was an underdog against the larger Porsche teams with professional drivers, but they worked hard to prepare the car for this grueling event and the drivers stayed out of trouble. With 30 minutes to go, and both the Porsche and the Pontiac in the pits at the same time, the Alegra crew serviced their car and got it back on the track sooner than their competition, sealing the win.

"The car was running hot near the end of the race, and the second-place Pontiac closed to within seven seconds, but we short-shifted the engine, were easy on the brakes, and stayed away from traffic to stay in front," said Dumoulin, the Grand-Am ST1 champion in 2002 and the GS1 champion in 2003. He also is a previous class winner (SGS in a Porsche 911 GT3 Cup) at the Rolex 24.

"We struggled through winter test days and most of practice without getting the set-up right, and then, right before qualifying on Thursday, we got it right," said de Quesada, owner of Alegra Motorsports.

Marc Basseng, the German member of the driving team, is a consultant for the Porsche factory as a test driver of the Porsche 911 race cars at the Weissach research and development center.

The #85 Farnbacher Loles Porsche 911 GT3 Cup (Dirk Werner, Jorg Hardt, Pierre Ehret and Leh Keen)lead the GT class for 397 laps, or more than 15 hours before an oil leak and an overheating engine ended their race with only one hour and 15 minutes to go. Before that, the #74 Tafel Racing Porsche 911 GT3 Cup, driven by Wolf Henzler, Eric Lux, Jim Tafel and Dominik Farnbacher took the lead at the start, but fell back in the seventh hour when a flat tire came apart and broke a radiator and suspension pieces. In all, Porsche 911 GT3 Cup race cars finished in six of the top ten places in the GT class. It marks Porsche's 61st class win at the 24 Hours at Daytona, and the 36th win for a Porsche 911 – based race car.

PCA Change to the Harness Standard

Dear PCA National Staff and Region Presidents,

The purpose of this email is to inform you of a change in the Driver's Education National Standards regarding the use of safety harnesses which will become effective on Jan.1, 2008. The current "Equal Restraint" Standard states that both the student and instructor shall have the same restraint system.

The problem with this Standard is that it does not define the complete system, in terms of the type of seat to be used with a 5 or 6 point harness. The new "Harness" Standard (See below) is written to compliment the "Equal Restraint" Standard and will go into effect January 1, 2008, but a region may adopt the standard earlier.

The new standard states that if a harness system is installed, it must be used in conjunction with a seat with manufacturer supplied routing holes for the shoulder and anti-submarine belts. These routing holes insure that the belts will remain in place when needed. A one piece seat is recommended but not required for it may interfere with the operation of the OEM three piece belt required for street application.

Thank you for your help in implementing this new standard. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

Harness Systems: revised 1/22/07

If the participant chooses to install a 5/6 point driving harness (four point systems are not safe and therefore not allowed) several changes to the automobile must be made to create a safe occupant restraint system. Harnesses must include an antisubmarine strap and be mounted in an approved manner consistent with the manufacturer's instructions. The Harness system must be used in conjunction with a seat which has the supplied routing holes for the shoulder and anti-submarine belts. All pieces of the restraint system must be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

This means that a seat is required to have the proper routing holes for the harness as supplied by the seat manufacturer for the shoulder, lap and anti-submarine straps. The shoulder straps should be mounted at 90 degrees to the axis of your spine or at most 40 degrees down from horizontal. Because the addition of the harness system means that the occupants are fastened upright in the vehicle, a properly padded roll bar or roll cage is strongly encouraged to complete the SYSTEM. The use of one without the other may result in an unsafe environment and is not a COMPLETE SYSTEM. Due to UV degradation and wear the harness webbing must be replaced every five years.
