

"Retrospective" by Margie & Jack Back, Historians

Did you ever play "I remember when..." with long-time friends or family? What fun it can be to recall former times and happenings. I have asked a few Sequoia Region members to play "I remember when..." Here are a couple of responses.

From Jerry and Gaila Peloian:

The type of attire we wear to meetings has changed over the years from more formal to causal. In the late 1960's all the men wore red sport coats to the dinner meetings. Every male club member had a red coat. Each coat had the San Joaquin Region patch. The women also "dressed up" for the dinner meetings. It was really a night out.

We remember those trips to Death Valley in the 1970's. On one of the return trips a rod bearing went out on our 1968 912. On the last hill over Walker Pass, there was that "oh, no" sound and the car lost power as it rolled to a stop on the side of the road. There were, of course, no cell phones. So one of the members drove to the next town and had a tow truck come and tow the 912 to town. We had to leave it parked at the tow truck driver's home until we could get a pickup and trailer. We came back to Fresno in Dick Arnold's 912 with Gaila sitting in the back seat. The next day with pickup and trailer in tow, the 912 made it safely back to Fresno.

My most memorable autocross was held on a bright, sunny, warm day in October 1974 at Marchbanks Stadium, a 1.9 mile tri-oval also known as the Hanford Speedway. I was Autocross Chairman that year and since the San Joaquin Region of PCA had held several memorable autocrosses there in previous years, everyone was looking forward to the opportunity of getting into 4th or 5th gear and speeds over 100 mph. A couple of years earlier USAC had held an Indy car race there so a good portion of the pavement was fairly new, but the surface was weathering from lack of use. Jon Koobation and I had laid out a course with some cones and decided to check it out before calling it good. Jon suggested we take his '58 Speedster for a trial run before sweeping the sand off the laid out course.

As you may have already guessed, at the first turn we hit a sandy spot and hit the outer concrete barrier wall at about 50 mph which demolished Jon's Speedster and sent me to the hospital with a fractured spine, two cracked ribs and a broken scapula (shoulder blade for all the non-medical folks). Dr. Gene Gilpin was on the scene and supervised emergency procedures and I was transported by makeshift ambulance (Dick Broemmel's station wagon) to Sacred Heart Hospital in Hanford. After transport by Jones ambulance to Sierra Hospital in Fresno, I got to call, my wife, Dianne, and tell her what had happened. After ten days in Sierra Hospital I was released to go home. That was and is my last and most memorable autocross.

Tires at High Speed

Tire inflation specs are based on what the manufacturer considers "normal" driving conditions. But, because of the cars we drive and the Club we belong to, many of us have the opportunity to go beyond "normal" driving conditions at the track during the Driver Education events organized by our PCA and other auto clubs in the area.



Let's try to put it in perspective.

Even though we tend to think that properly inflated tires are perfectly round, they truly aren't. Because of the weight they carry (vehicle, fluids and passenger (s)), the bottom half of the tire's sidewalls bulge and the tread flattens where it contacts the road. But on the top half of the tire, the sidewalls straighten out and the tread curves back into its molded round shape. This difference in shape between the top and bottom halves of a tire is known as "deflection".

This deflection will occur with every revolution of the tire, so picture this: A 225/45/ZR17 tire could be considered a standard front tire in a Boxster, Cayman or Carrera. This particular tire has a 25 inch overall diameter and after doing the math we know that this tire will turn approximately 807 times every mile. At 25 miles per hour this tire will roll 5.6 times per second, at 70 mph (speed limit

on the Interstate) it will roll15.7 times per second and at 140 mph (speed right before braking for turn 17 at Sebring) the tire will roll a daunting 31.4 times every second. This means that the tire is changing its shape from its unloaded to its loaded state and back every 3/100th of a second.

This constant tire deflection plus the friction of the tire against the road (track) generates tremendous heat build-up in the tires. Since the tires are filled with air (or nitrogen) which is a gas, Boyles Law demonstrates that if the volume of gas is maintained constant, its pressure is directly proportional to its temperature, therefore your tire pressure will go up as the tire gets used, and the faster the tires spin, the faster the temperature and therefore the pressure will build up.

The rule of thumb is that the tire's pressure will increase by 1 psi for every 10° Fahrenheit increase in temperature, or 1 psi for every 4 minutes of use during the first 20 minutes of operation.

All of the above to basically say that the faster you go, the higher your tire pressure will be.

So, when we're at the track or Auto-x we must keep in mind that we will have a

tire pressure increase as soon as the tires start to heat up. This will alter our car's handling, so we need to carefully monitor the pressure throughout the different sessions during the day.

But how do we know what the ideal pressure is? We should generally start with the recommended pressures from the car's manufacturer. Then, the tires will tell us if they need more or less pressure.

Most modern high-speed rated tires have special markers to show us the optimal tire patch.

This triangle tells us where the edge of the optimal tread wear should be. As you can see in the photo (previous page), the wear is a little short of the marker, meaning that we have too much pressure.

Dropping a couple of pounds of pressure and then hitting the track again gives us the optimal patch, as seen below where the edge of the wear is right to the tip of the marker.



Happy Porsche'ing, Pedro Also, always keep in mind that you should never inflate beyond the tire's maximum pressure, stamped on its sidewall.


